



COVID-19: HEALTH & SAFETY PROCEDURES

In order to ensure the health and safety of passengers and crew throughout the cruising experience, St. Lawrence Cruise Lines has instituted a number of safety procedures designed to protect against the spread of Covid-19. These procedures have been thoughtfully developed in accordance with federal and regional health and safety guidelines. These procedures may change according to the evolving state of the pandemic and current government initiatives to slow or stop Covid-19.

Passenger Screening (Pre-Cruise)	All passengers will be required to provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test (NAAT/PCR or antigen) result within 72 hours of travel. This will be confirmed at the time of boarding with a temperature check and declaration of status. All crew members will be assessed and tested prior to boarding.
Passenger Monitoring (Cruising)	Passengers will receive a daily temperature check and the well-being of all passengers and crew will be monitored throughout the cruise.
Reduced Passenger Capacity	St. Lawrence Cruise Lines will be operating with a reduced passenger capacity throughout the pandemic. The capacity will be adjusted in accordance with provincial and regional health authorities.
Transportation and Shore Tours	All shore tours and transportation to and from attractions have been vetted and approved by the Cruise Line in order to ensure that they meet provincial and federal health and safety guidelines.
Masks/Face Coverings	Masks will be required in shared public areas of the vessel, except for the outer decks when there is sufficient airflow and physical distance. This includes transit through the companionways of the vessel. Masks are not required in the dining room during meals or in the privacy of staterooms.
Physical Distancing	Passengers are encouraged to maintain a 6' distance from fellow travellers who are not in their social bubble. The Grand Saloon (dining room) has been laid out to accommodate physical distancing with controlled access during meal times.
Hand Sanitation Stations	Hand sanitation stations have been placed throughout the ship for passengers, as well as in common crew areas.
Shore Tour Sanitization	Shore tours will be conducted separate from the public, and travellers will be encouraged to practice physical distancing during tours when possible. Hand sanitation will be facilitated before and after visiting attractions.
Surface Disinfectant	A surface disinfectant regime will be used for all high touch surfaces with cleaning products that have been federally recommended to protect against Covid-19
Clorox 360 Electrostatic Disinfectant Program	Our hospital-grade electrostatic cleaning system has been endorsed by Health Canada and will be used to disinfect all luggage and staterooms prior to boarding, as well as for the daily sanitization of all common interior areas.
