

ITINERARY - M/V CANADIAN EMPRESS
HARVEST & COLOUR CRUISE
KINGSTON TO MONTREAL TO KINGSTON (7 nights - 8 days)

- DAY 1 1630 - Pre-boarding commences on Crawford Dock in Kingston.
1730-1830 - Passenger boarding
1800 - Captain's Welcome Reception in the Grand Saloon
1900 - Depart Kingston bound for 1000 Islands Anchorage
Dinner - Empress Class Roast Prime Rib of Beef
After Dinner - Enjoy the beauty of the 1000 Islands on the upper deck with complimentary chocolate and liqueurs
Evening - Stroll the outer decks under a million stars and among a thousand islands
- DAY 2 0730 - Weigh anchor to wander the 1000 Islands, Wanderer's Channel and Admiralty Group of Islands bound for Gananoque
0930 - Debark at Gananoque for a guided tour of the 1000 Islands Heritage Museum (*masks required*)
1100 - Depart Gananoque bound for Brockville, Ontario
Lunch - Comprehensive Safety Presentation
Afternoon - See Millionaires' Row on the U.S side. Sight Boldt and Singer Castles.
1515 - Arrive at Brockville and transfer by bus to the Aquatarium
1530 - Guided tour of the Aquatarium (*masks required*)
1700 - Return to ship for departure to Upper Canada Village
- Cruise past Windmill Point and along the Old Galop Canal - opened 1846
Evening - Arrive at Chrysler Park Marina
- Relax and enjoy the marina grounds
Evening - Evening Entertainment and lounge services
- DAY 3 0915 - Depart by horse-drawn wagon to Upper Canada Village. After an open-air guided tour, passengers will have free time to discover the Village
1200 - Transportation returns from Village
1230 - Depart Chrysler Park Marina bound for Coteau Landing, Quebec
Afternoon - Transit Eisenhower & Snell Locks (USA)
Evening - Ship arrives at Coteau Landing, Quebec
- Free time to relax and stroll along the old canal system
Evening - Fun-loving entertainment and lounge services
- DAY 4 0700 - Depart Coteau Landing bound for Lachine (near Montreal)
Morning - Pass through Beauharnois Locks (2) - Upper & Lower into Lake St. Louis
1100 - Cruise Lac St. Louis and view the approach to Montreal
1330 - Arrive at Lachine and chance to enjoy Parc St. Louis
1400 - Depart by bus for guided tour to downtown Montreal
1500 - Guided tour of the Botanical Gardens (*masks required*)
1700 - Return to the Canadian Empress for dinner
Evening - Fun loving entertainment and lounge services

- DAY 5 0915 - Depart by bus to visit the Fur Trade Museum (*masks required*)
 1130 - Depart Lachine bound for Cornwall, Ontario
 Afternoon - Pass through Beauharnois Locks (2) - Upper & Lower
 - Shipboard activities
 Early Evening- Arrive Cornwall
 Evening - Fun loving entertainment and lounge services
- DAY 6 0945 - Debark and transfer to Moses Saunders Power Dam for guided tour (*masks required*)
 1130 - Return to ship for departure to Morrisburg, Ontario
 Afternoon - Transit Eisenhower and Snell Locks (USA)
 1630 - Arrive at Morrisburg, Ontario.
 - Free time to relax and explore the area around the Morrisburg Municipal Wharf
 Evening - Fun-loving entertainment and lounge services
- DAY 7 0930 - Step-on Speaker: Maggie Wheeler is a murder mystery author with an expertise
 regarding St. Lawrence Seaway history
 1130 - Return to the ship for departure bound for Brockville, Ontario
 Afternoon - Pass through Iroquois Seaway Control Lock
 1430 - Disembark at Prescott for a tour of historic Fort Wellington
 1445 - Guided tour of Fort Wellington (*masks required*)
 1630 - Ship departs Prescott bound for Brockville in the heart of the 1000 Islands
 Evening - Arrive at Brockville for overnight
 Late Evening - Celebration Night with fun-loving entertainment
- DAY 8 0600 - Depart Brockville
 Morning - Cruise Millionaires' Row on the U.S. Side of the 1000 Islands bound for Gananoque
 1030 - Debark at Gananoque for a guided tour of the 1000 Islands Boat Museum
 (*masks required*)
 1145 - Depart from Gananoque bound for Kingston, Ontario
 Lunch - Closing Ceremonies
 1330 - Arrival at Kingston
 1400 - Disembarkation and farewells at Crawford Wharf
